INTERVIEW:

P. J. : Who and what factors play a role in your being a cancer survivor of almost 8 years?

Ellen: There is quote that states... ‘Faith is the bird that feels the light and sings while the dawn is still dark.’ For me, despite the twists and turns of walking this unending cancer path for what will soon be 8 years, because of my faith in God and His son, Jesus, my soul sings with incurable joy and hope. For me, I know it is His hand that guides my doctors and medical team to administer the cutting-edge treatments that have saved my life thus far. And, I know it is His hand that is guiding the researchers to find new treatments so they can be made available to patients like me. In my heart, my number one physician is God.

P. J.: I know that you organized a group called “Ellen’s Angels” to raise support for American Cancer Society. How much money have you raised and what other volunteer work have you done ‘between chemo treatments’ all these years?

Ellen: In truth, I've lost track of how much money we as "Ellen's Angels" have raised for breast cancer research and local program services over the past 8 years... I know it is at least \$125,000 (All funds raised have been in support of the American Cancer Society). Between chemo treatments I strive to be an assistance to others who are journeying this cancer path... and I do volunteer work for various breast-cancer related organizations as well.
